There were 6 Post Offices in Chesterfield Township!

Chesterfield Post Office (22 Mile Rd & Gratiot) March 10, 1875 to July 15, 1907

District Heart Post Office (Chesterfield Rd & 25 Mile Rd) March 21, 1837 to September 22, 1838

East Union Post Office (Fairchild Rd between 23 & 24 Mile Rd) January 10, 1856 to November 4, 1864

Fairchild Post Office (23 Mile Rd & Fairchild) Est. 1906, discontinued unknown

Milton Post Office (Bates Rd & 24 Mile Rd) January 10, 1838 to July 15, 1904

New Baltimore Office Est. September 26, 1851, active

Chesterfield Township Farm Production Statistics, 1850—1880

The United States Federal Census is a well-known resource for genealogy and population studies. Did you know that the United States Federal Census Bureau also compiled statistics on individual farms? The Production of Agriculture Census, taken every ten years from 1850 to 1880 recorded the number of farms, acres and various farm animals by individual farmer in the community. Below is a compiled total of farm production for Chesterfield Township, Macomb County, Michigan.
